Discussion Points

HEALTH CARE

- Mental health remains a care issue, especially children's care
 - Levy has failed numerous times for funding care options
- Aging population is a concern – state funds remain critical to offering care options
- Community Health Council has three projects in mind:
 - Provide a free clinic for uninsured residents (there are 8,000 uninsured under 65)
 - Expand space and services of Dental Clinic
 - Hire new dentist, hygienist
 - Regular appointments booked until June 2009, space available for emergencies
 - Childhood obesity awareness/prevention
- Funding is difficult to find for free clinic – sliding fee scale method is challenging
- Access to mental health services is limited
 - No levy passage means no funds available
 - Medicaid takes over if client is uninsured

HOUSING

- Affordable housing options are limited
- Habitat for Humanity doing well, needs more land ready to build on
 - Already developed with water/sewer, etc.
- There is more need than resources
- Washington-Morgan County Community Action is an asset (offering many programs)

- Floods of 2004-2005 took away some available housing stock – has not been replaced
- Homelessness is a different problem in Appalachia
 - Families living together, friends taking one another in
- EVE is an asset
- Joe Gage at Buckeye Hills – Area Agency on Aging has written several grants to assist with foreclosure, homelessness
- Increasing need for senior housing
 - Especially assisted living facilities

INFRASTRUCTURE

- Large financial need
- Rural population shift adds to cost
 - More expensive to develop rural land than urban
- Broadband access critical, yet difficult to obtain due to rural location
- Sanitary sewer remains a large need

EDUCATION

- Due to high cost of education, there is a lack of focus on employer needs
 - People are worried about paying off their education loans, rather than thinking about what their employer needs
- There remains an unfilled demand for high-skilled jobs (welding, plumbers, etc.)
 - More low-paying jobs being filled (service industry)
 - Lack of interest in training for high-skilled trades
 - Lack of interest among young people in planning for career/future jobs
- Difficult to reach young people with message of career opportunities
- Certification costs are too high for unemployed/underemployed to achieve
- Remains an overall emphasis on college rather than locally-needed skills that still pay well

TOURISM

- “Country Tourism” is a new option worth exploring

- Wayne National Forest, trails, rivers are assets in this category
- Need to utilize our natural resources more to draw tourists here
- Fear of change (example – using Wayne National Forest as a draw is new, could be intimidating)
- Need for a convention center that can host 500 people
 - Look at Cambridge Pritchett-McLaughlin Center as example
- Visits by River Queens are an asset (Delta Queen, Mississippi Queen, etc.)

TRANSPORTATION

- Explore option of using rivers more to transport freight
 - Take more freight off of roads, reduce infrastructure maintenance costs
